Playwork.

At our Club the emphasis is on play and choice for children. Activities include arts and crafts, games and outdoor sports. Imaginative play is encouraged and a television and DVD player with game consoles are available. In the holidays outings may include visits to the park, cinema, swimming, bowling and further afield. Where possible the Club is run on the principles of Playwork. Here are the first 2 principles.

- All children and young people need to play. The impulse to play is innate. Play is a biological, psychological and social necessity, and is fundamental to the healthy development and well-being of individuals and communities.
- Play is the process that is freely chosen, personally directed and intrinsically motivated. That is, children and young people determine and control the content of their own play, by following their instincts, ideas and interests, in their own way for their own reasons..


